## GENERAL RULES, CONDITIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Federation rule book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

**Entry forms:** Care should be taken to enter each horse in its proper class. Exhibitors are responsible for their errors and those of their agents in making out entry forms.

**Entry forms must.** . .be signed by the exhibitor, rider, driver, handler, coach (if applicable) and trainer or agent. In the case of a rider under 18, his/her parent or guardian, or if not available, the trainer must sign an entry on the minor's behalf. ....show the mailing address and phone number of owner and trainer and rider.

**Credentials:** Exhibitors must present the following credentials to the horse show.

1. USEF/USHJA membership card
2. USEF/USHJA amateur certification
3. USEF/USHJA large, small, junior hunter & pony measure card
4. USEF/USHJA horse recording

We recommend that photo copies of the above cards be sent with entries.

**Closing of Entries/Post Entries/Scratches:** Entries for Mid Season close August 2, 2010. Post entries accepted after that date and during the show at regular fees plus \$20 per horse. Substitutions or transfers allowed at \$5 per horse and/or rider per class. All classes scratched will be charged \$5.00 per class. No gate adds on Sunday please.

**Returned Checks:** Checks returned by the bank for any reason will incur a \$50 charge, and will be re-deposited. In case the check is returned a second time, to retain entries all fees plus penalties must be paid by money order, cashier's check or cash prior to 4 p.m. the day before the show. In the event a check is returned by the bank after the completion of the show, it will be handled in accordance with USEF GR913.

**Cancellation and Refunds:** Exhibitors canceling after the closing date of entries shall forfeit their entry fees, except in the case of disability of entry. Should an entry be unable to compete due to illness or injury, a refund will be made upon presentation to the show secretary a certificate from a veterinarian (on official letterhead) prior to the first class in which the horse is entered. No refunds of entries shall be made after the start of the show unless the veterinarian certificate is issue by the official show veterinarian and a refund form filled out in the show office. Refunds will cover only those classes in which the horse has not yet competed. In either case, a \$5 scratch fee for each class will be retained.

**Conditions of Competition:** Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Franklinshows / Horses and People LLC will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Mid-Season Hunter Show, it's management, The United States Equestrian Federation, the ASPCA and the National Horse Show Association of America (including their officers, directors, officials, agents, servants, volunteers and employees) harmless for any illness, loss or accident which may occur by fire or otherwise. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses/ponies. They therefore are strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

**USEF membership statement:** Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 non-member registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

## GENERAL RULES CON'T.

**USEF Fees:** A \$15 fee will be charged for each horse participating in any competition recognized by USEF. (\$7 equine drug and medication fee to provide for research, inspection and enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs). A \$2 USHJA Zone fee will be charged for each horse in performance and/or equitation classes.

**Management:** Management reserves the right to cancel any classes that do not fill to their satisfaction. Management will provide a full refund of entry fees for classes that do not fill or are canceled due to severe weather or other emergency. Management reserves the right to start the first class of any session 30 minutes earlier than the scheduled time if entries or weather warrants and can make changes of arenas, judges, schooling or class orders to facilitate time schedule and conditions.

**Trophies, Ribbons and Prize Money:** Trophy and ribbons will be awarded to eight places in all classes. No prize money is offered.

**Horse Show Office:** 7:00am-6:00pm on the day of the horse show.

**Stabling :** Permanent 12'x12' stalls with doors will be available beginning Friday August 6, after 3:00 pm, for a charge of \$40/day or \$75.00 for Fri. and Sat. night. Please indicate arrival and departure date and who you are to be stabled with on the entry blank.

**Haul-ins:** There will be a \$35 charge for each horse hauled in.

**Schooling and Exercise: Schooling/warm-up areas will be available from Friday 4:00pm to 7:00pm & Saturday /Sunday 7am to 7:45am on the day of the horse show.**

**Sharps Containers:** Located by wash racks

### **Motorized Vehicles:**

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

**Dogs:** Dogs must be on a leash at all times and Owners will be fined \$50 for dogs loose on the grounds (\$100 in arena/schooling areas).

**Arenas and Footing:** Indoor competition arena: 100x200 w/Lightfoot footing. Schooling & warm-up areas are dirt and sand.

### **Protective Headgear:**

In accordance with Rule GR801, **all exhibitors must wear protective head gear** (that meets or exceeds ASTM standards and carry the SEI tag) while mounted anywhere on the show grounds. In addition, all junior riders must comply with USEF GR318. Any rider violating these rules at any time will immediately be prohibited from further riding until his/her head gear is properly in compliance with these rules.

**Pessoa/USEF National Hunter Seat Medal****Jumps to 3'6"****\$55.00**

Open to Junior Active Members of the Federation who have not yet reached their 18th birthday. Application for membership can be made direct to the Federation office or the exhibitor can join prior to the class through the steward. To be shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles at 3'6" which must include one combination including an oxer and two changes of direction (change of lead) after the first obstacle. Two cumulative refusals in the USEF Hunter Seat Medal Finals will result in elimination, see EQ110.1. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. Tests 1-19. Any exhibitor who does not participate in the testing is placed last of those exhibitors called back to test. Should more than one exhibitor fail to return for testing they will be placed at the judge's discretion. Only one rider per horse. To fill a class six competitors must complete the course.

**ASPCA****Jumps to 3'6"****\$55.00**

Open to Junior Riders who have not reached their 18th birthday. Rider and trainer must be current members of the ASPCA/NHSAA, and must show their ASPCA numbers on the entry blank. Junior rider annual contributions shall be \$35. Trainer annual contribution shall be \$50. Fees should be payable and sent directly to the National Horse Show Association of America, P.O. Box 386, Greenvale, NY 11548. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences at 3'6" with or without wings. Two cumulative refusals in the ASPCA Maclay Finals will result in elimination, see EQ110.1. A minimum of twelve riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot and canter. To be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of horse. The Under Saddle performance of those riders selected to show under saddle shall count 50%. Only one rider per horse. USEF Tests 1-19. To fill a class six (6) competitors must complete the course (five in Alaska and Hawaii). If 50 or more entries are received three hours prior to the class, the class must be divided by every other number and run as two separate classes. In order to qualify for the Zone 9 Regional Finals conducted by the National Horse Show, a contestant must win 13 pts. POINT SYSTEM:

PLACING NUMBER OF ENTRANTS 6-15, 16-30, 30+ .

1st place =10, 20, 30. 2nd place =6, 12, 18. 3rd place =4, 8, 12. 4th place =2, 4, 6.

Once a rider has qualified for their Maclay regional final, he/she may continue to ride in the Maclay classes until he/she has acquired 60 points . Classes held after August 31 will count toward the next year's finals. Any rider who will not be eligible to compete in the next year as a junior should not compete in qualifying classes after August 31.

**Platinum Performance/USEF Talent Search****Jumps to 3'9"****\$55.00**

A test of the abilities of an individual as a show jumping rider, is open to Junior/Young Riders who are members of the Federation, who have not reached their 21st birthday under Federation rules. Winners of twenty Talent Search Classes are no longer eligible to compete in the USEF SHOW JUMPING TALENT SEARCH CLASS, but may compete in the Finals until they reach their 21st birthday under Federation rules. Winners of the Finals may continue to compete in the USEF SHOW JUMPING TALENT SEARCH CLASS, in pursuit of additional wins leading towards Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals in recognition of these wins, but may not compete in future Finals. Non-U.S. citizens may compete in the USEF SHOW JUMPING TALENT SEARCH CLASS, but not the Finals. If 50 or more entries are received three hours prior to the start of the class, the class must be divided equally and run as two separate classes. Competitors must use the same horse in both phases. Competitors may ride stallions. The jumping phase of the class shall be over a course of at least ten fences from 3'6" to 3'9" in height with spreads to five feet. Each course must contain no fewer than three fences set at 3'9" in height. The course must include a double and a triple combination, or 3 doubles. Additional spread fences are required elsewhere on the course and an obstacle with water is recommended (required in Zones 7-12 and obligatory in the Finals). The course should be of the type used in a Junior or Pre-liminary Jumper class. Time allowed will be figured at 360 yards per minute; may be timed either electronically or manually. To be judged on style and execution. Time and jumping faults should be taken into consideration in the judge's evaluation of the rider.

In the flat phase, not more than 30 riders at one time will show as a group at the working walk, the working trot sitting, the working trot rising, as well as showing a lengthening of stride; the working canter, and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. All riders being considered for an award shall be required to show the working canter on the counter lead for at least one full revolution of the arena in both directions, but not more than 12 shall counter canter at one time. Judges may require any additional tests. To be judged on rider's position and seat and the correctness and effect of the aids. All riders must ride in the first phase offered. At least 20 riders, if available, or 50% of the entries, if that is a greater number, must be called back for the second phase. Rider participation in the first phase, whether it is the jumping phase or flat phase, constitutes entry into the class as a whole, regardless of whether the rider is called back for the second phase. To fill a class, SIX COMPETITORS MUST COMPLETE THE COURSE. SADDLERY. 1. There are no restrictions on saddles. 2. Change of bridle is permissible, between phases. 3. Blinkers are forbidden. 4. No martingales of any kind are permitted in the flat phase. 5. Only running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted in the jumping phase. Standing martingales, draw reins, or restricted running martingales are prohibited. 6. Reins must be attached to the bit(s) or directly to the bridle. Gags and hackamores are not allowed in the flat phase..
